For fans of Ghost Adventures, this book is a treasure. Zak talks about what goes on behind the scenes and everything that goes into making an episode. It's fascinating and well-written. I'm not sure I believe everything that Zak believes about God and the afterlife, but I do believe that he has had significant life-changing experiences with the paranormal. I love his sense of humor throughout most of the book. But I thought that he should have cut completely the chapter about the airplane bathroom incident. It was irrelevant and unnecessary, and really only made Zak seem insecure. I was also a little put off by Zak's blatant omission of Nick Groff in the chapter that named his closest friends and "family". I know Nick's not with the show anymore, but could there be some bad blood involved in his leaving? Nevertheless, I found it a very entertaining book, much better than his first, Dark World.

Pushing the ego aside, Bagans raises some interesting questions about the realm of the afterlife. Bagans weaves an insightful journey of his personal life as a TV personality/real life ghostbuster and occasionally inspires reflective thought on some of the deeper and darker areas surrounding the world of the paranormal. I give this book 4/5 simply because I feel a distinctive conclusion is missing. Apart from that it is interesting to explore this topic through the prism of fame and deadlines. Mixed in with a few crazy fan girls/spirits and you'll likely find yourself giggling at some of the antics described in this book. A great read for the secret armchair paranormal investigator in all of us!

I sincerely enjoyed reading this book. To be fair, it's probably for people who are already familiar with Zak Bagans and his work on Ghost Adventures.
