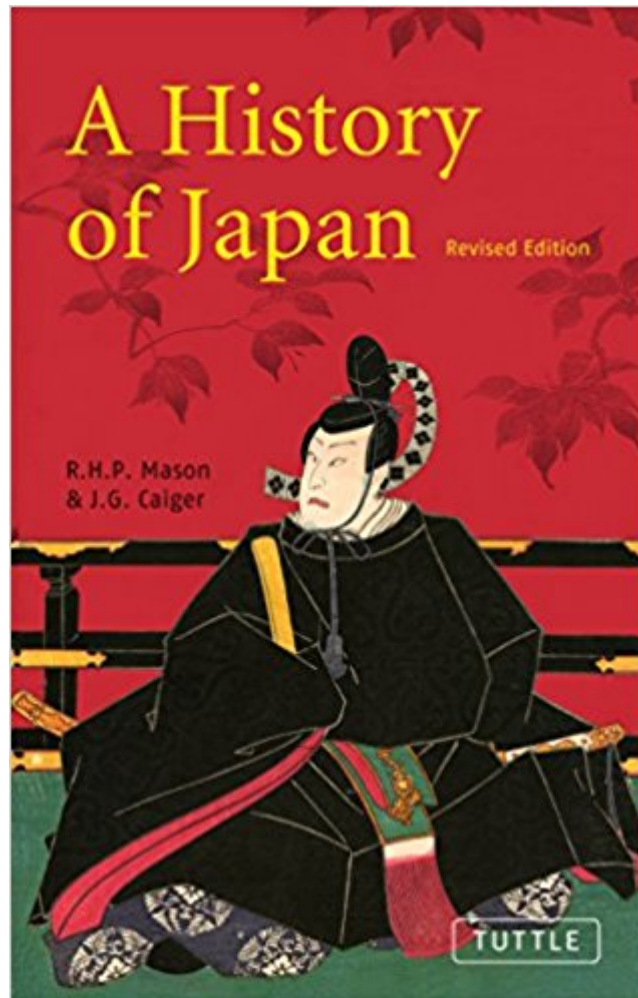




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A History Of Japan: Revised Edition

Interesting

This is the most complete coverage of Japanese history in an ebook I have yet seen. very impressive piece of work.

Very thorough and detailed historical work. Slightly long-winded and convoluted at times yet offers

one the opportunity to learn about even little known or irrelevant facts about the formation of Japan and its progression towards its period of modernization and Western-styled civilization.

Sorts out Myths from Legends and clearly delineates the centrality of the faith that death, even by suicide, is honourable - a very strong difference from most Western societies. While some History books of Japan start at the stone age, nearly 3,000 years ago this one at least differentiates the facts that start nearer to 780 AD, with earlier material seen as mythological or legendary. I am intrigued mostly by the colonisation of the Japanese islands and the analogy with such colonisations of North America and Australia and New Zealand (and several other countries) by Europeans and the like, to the reduction and often elimination of the original native peoples, but the Anui of Japan have some of their story told in this book. Do any readers know if the full story of the Anui has ever really been told??

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
