Probably a bit mistitled. Grammatical errors notwithstanding, it's actually a well researched book on

the history of corruption in Reno, just not necessarily a history of the mafia in Reno. There's a simple explanation for this. There never was much of a mafia in Reno. Like San Francisco, Reno had a tight knit law enforcement and business community that just didn't leave doors open for the syndicate. That being said, Reno wasn't mob-free, either. The usual suspects made their way through town, from Siegel to Lanskey to Sam Giancana, but they just did not have the inroads in Reno that they had in Vegas. In fact, much of the content about the Italian and Jewish gangsters really involves Lake Tahoe more than Reno. 3 bucks on kindle, however. It was worth a "skim" (no pun intended!).
