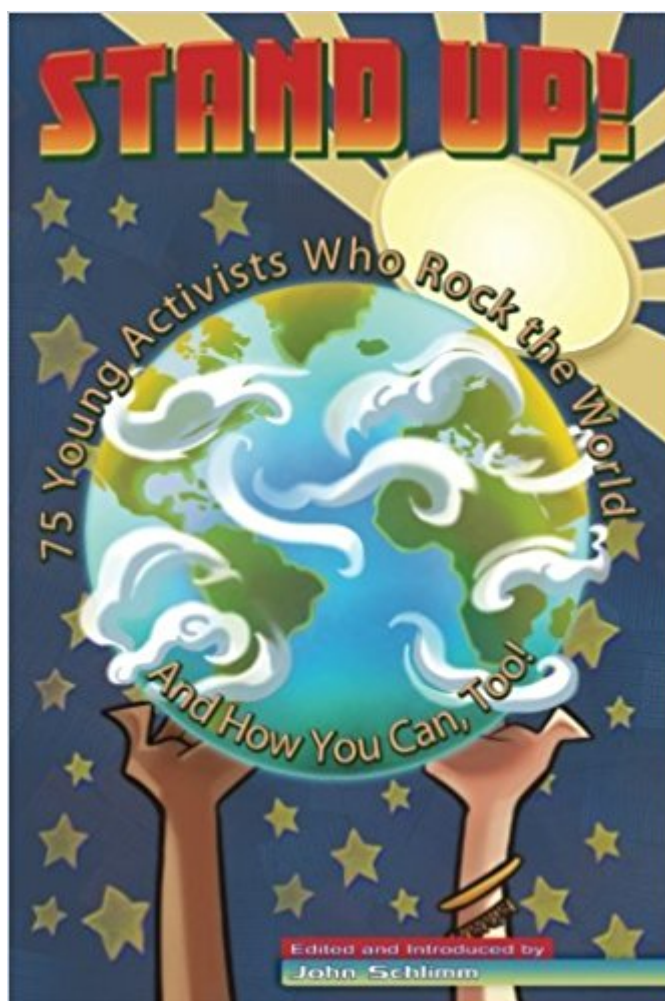

I bought this to read the short stories to my daughter, hoping to inspire her to do the same. The essays seem to be written by the teenagers. While it is great that they are getting involved, the essays don't necessarily describe an inspiring turning point where they realized this was important to do... like a lesson learned. It would have been better if the stories were edited or re-written to include that inspirational moment. But, after only 3 or 4 stories, my daughter has lost interest in the book.
