Emma moved across the state to live with her dad, whose binge drinking has become a big liability. But she believes she has found salvation in her boyfriend, Dillon, who provides her with a safe place and shared friends at school and has made a commitment to be with her forever. Dillon's life is also difficult, though, and when Emma receives a dream opportunity for a study abroad program, his surprising negative reaction begins the downward spiral of their relationship. As he starts to question Emma's devotion to him, love turns into manipulation and abuse. With a fresh voice, Dominy adeptly depicts how love can grow dark and that abuse isn't always physical. Do we listen, or heed the pressures of others?Emma life turned upside down after her parents divorced and she moved across town to live with her alcoholic father. But Dillon makes everything better. Until he doesn't.Amy Dominy did a great job creating a main character with sense and inner strength, who still falls prey to a troubled

boyfriend. For all the upheaval in her life over the past year, Emma is a confident, sensitive young woman. She had a passion for archeology, is deeply devoted to her father and boyfriend. She also lacks the support to help her when Dillon becomes manipulative and controlling. Or maybe she has the support but avoids people, like her sister and favorite teacher, who will tell her what she needs to hear. I love that Emma wasn't a weak character, because even strong girls and women can fail to recognize warning signs of a troubled relationship. Dominy gave Emma a thoughtful, compelling voice. The perfect pacing added authenticity to DIE FOR YOU without being overly dramatic. Emma and Dillon's story could take place in any high school. I strongly recommend DIE FOR YOU to teens and parents as an example of an emotionally abusive, controlling relationship spinning out of control.

Such a page turner, this YA love story took over my weekend. If this book was food, it would be a banana split---at first it makes you feel really good, but by the time you're near the end, you feel kind of sick. Dominy does a great job of introducing us to these seemingly ordinary teenagers, then simmers the plot until the relationships reach the boiling point. I appreciated that the boyfriend of the main character was not portrayed as a "bad guy" but instead we see the shades of gray of mental illness. What's the difference between passion and true love? I loved the parallel story of the last day in Pompeii as well. A really powerful novel about love and obsession.

Was lucky to read an early version of this book and I LOVED IT! Writing clever banter is one of Amy Fellner Dominy's strengths, along with getting to the heart of relationships. But the best part of this story, is how Dominy shows the deceptively innocent way one can find themselves in a bad situation. Love the writing, love the message. I can't wait to read it again when it comes out, and have everyone else meet these characters!

What starts as a story of teen-age love turns dark, and once the reader realizes that Emma is in danger, there's no putting the book aside. Confusion, guilt, mixed loyalties, good intentions gone wrong, hard choices, prioritizing demands and needs - all there and handled adroitly.

This cautionary tale of losing oneself in another is a great read for young and old. Important lessons for our kids to learn are brought to light in this book which speaks to the perils of "love" and lost
