

Synopsis

Soon, it’s not just her gown that’s tripping her up. Trading in the Internet and electricity for stars and campfires was supposed to make life simpler, but Ro is finding that love is the ultimate complication. Can she let the past make way for her future?

Really well-drawn behind the scenes view of a small renaissance faire - it's like the author met all these fantastic faire stereotypes and then got to know them well enough to write real, lovely characters for them all. The romantic plot, while predictable (there are only so many high school romances in the world to choose from without getting ridiculously melodramatic, and this book is funny without being ridiculous), is also sweet and captivating. The best part, though: the real story isn't about to faire or the boy, but about the heroine. I'm a sucker for a good finding-herself tale, and this book delivers perfectly.
