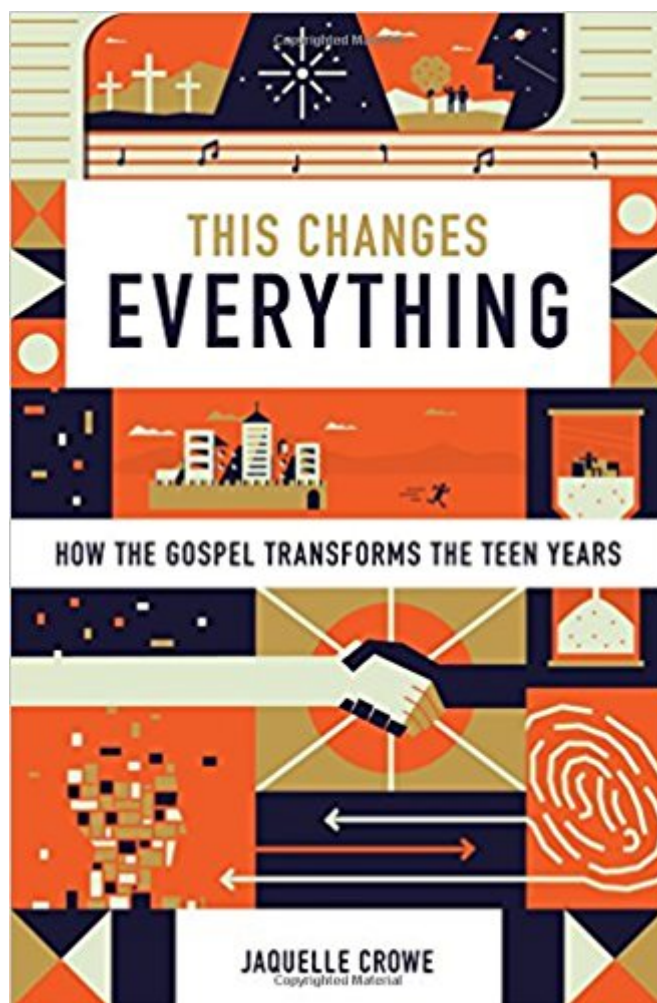

Every once in a while I pick up a book to review that I am somewhat interested in reading, but after the first couple of pages I become aware that I have something really solid in my hands. *This Changes Everything: How the Gospel Transforms the Teen Years* by Jaquelle Crowe was just that type of book for me. As a father of a teen and someone who has worked with youth in the church I am always on the look out for good books that will challenge young people. The challenge of *This Changes Everything* is quite straight forward: Don't waste your teen years living life the way the world expects you to live, instead live like a new creation in Christ who is capable of serving Him and His church in many ways. Crowe introduces the book with a picture of a young child moving past baby food and moving on to chicken nuggets. At some point the child has to recognize that the chicken nuggets provide more substance. Crowe states that "This Changes Everything is, in my mind, a chicken nugget. It's for young people who are Christians but no longer gumming spiritual baby food. We've eaten the basics and are still hungry for more. We're ready for meat and reject the fluff so often pressed on us. We really don't want to be talked down to. We want to know how to live a godly life as teenagers and as Christians, and we don't want to be spoon-fed when we're ready to dig in ourselves." Crowe continues with a Christ-centered charge for teens: If we love Jesus, we'll love truth, and we'll want to grow. We'll reject the status quo. These aren't our rebellious years; these are the years we rise up to obey the call of Christ. This isn't our time to slack off; it's our time to stand out. This isn't a season for self-satisfaction; it's a season for God-glorification. Our youth is by God's grace, in God's hands, and for God's fame. He is the whole point of our lives. *This changes everything* is a rich, Christ-centered book for teens that will encourage them to grow in their faith and serve God through their teens years instead of wasting them away. Again, Crowe is pointed and spot on when she

challenges teens, "We are Jesus-followers. That means we don't have to waste our lives. It means we do hard things. It means we turn our backs on what the world says is cool. It means we're members of a mission that will change everything. It means we stand out from those around us like blazing light in a pitch-black room. It means we're in a war, and we fight long and hard every day on the winning side. Make no mistake; Jesus changes everything. This is the truth I've learned: if you live for Jesus, you can't live an unchanged life. If the gospel is true, it will inescapably change every little part of us—what we do and think and say and mean, and who we hang out with and esteem and listen to and why, and how we live today and tomorrow and for all eternity. It will not be easy, safe, or always comfortable by any means. But it will be good. It will awake in you deep and unquenchable joy." I am incredible thankful for this book. I have read it, as has my daughter, and we passed around a copy to many other teens. A really outstanding book! I received a digital copy of this book from Crossway in exchange for an honest review.

This is a truly challenging book that after forty or so pages and a look at the epilogue convinced me it is one book that readers will find hard to put down. One need not be a teenager to feel the powerful hope reaching out that life can be changed. For those who feel they have lost too much, as in the sad story of "Thirteen Reasons Why" a teenage suicide, this book also written by a teenage girl presents the One Great Reason Why Not! If you are a teen reading this, then you will want to read for yourself what this teen is saying.

For me to actually take the time to write a book review indicates how worthwhile this book is. I am using this well-written resource with mothers and their teen daughters in a summer book study. It has been an absolute hit with this group. Jaquelle is an extremely gifted writer. She makes Jesus Christ the main thing. I am so thankful to see this in a young writer. The book is packed with Scripture and references many solid theologians. The reader can tell that Jaquelle has a high view of God and His Word. This book is written with teens in mind, and yet the adult readers in our group find that it resonates with them just as much! Jaquelle has a joyful tone throughout the text. The result, unsurprisingly, is a nudge to become more like Jesus as he, like the gospel, changes everything.
