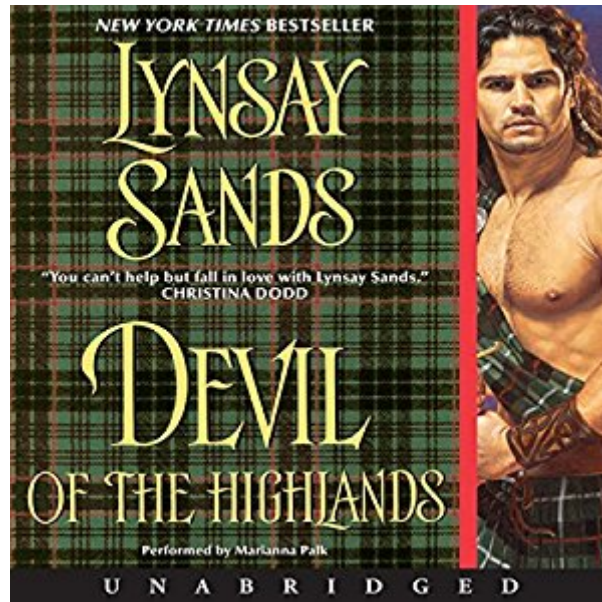

Lynsay Sands has written another fast paced, interesting, stay-up-all-night-to-read book! What wonderful, fully developed characters. I love Evelinde because she's intelligent and resourceful and wants to make a place for herself within her new clan. Can she solve the previous deaths? Is she putting her own life at risk by trying to solve them? You'll just have to read it to see, but I can tell you that the culprit will be a big surprise to you! Cullen has lived with being unjustly called the Devil of the Highlands for so long he's almost immune to it. Some people think he is responsible for the deaths of his father, uncle and first wife because he wanted to be Laird. Is that true? You will learn when you read the book. I had to giggle at the description of the first time Cullen sees Evelinde. What a

hoot -- of course he thought she was insane!The step-mother is truly wicked and I really hated that we didn't get to see her have some punishment for all she'd done to Evelinde. I would have loved it if the brother had come home and kicked the wicked witch out or something.

Cullen and Evelinde are such an amazing couple. I loved them. Cullen had such a direct way to protecting Evelinde from her evil step mother it was sweet. I enjoyed this read. There were moments I laughed out loud. The heroine is just what you find in a female. She talks expects Cullen the hero to be a master communicator, but she/we get grunts, sighs, and looks. This story has it all. There is very little interaction between the main characters for the first half of the book, and is written solely on Eveline's thoughts and interactions with a couple of supporting characters in The book. The characters are weak. Devil of the Highlands does a lot of grunting and some bellowing at his wife when she a few near misses. There isn't any supporting storyline to indicate why Cullen is considered the Devil. When I read a book I want to know what my characters are thinking, I want them to have friction, adventures together, wit, humor. The man needs to be brave, feared, gentle, and bemused by this woman that has changed his world. The lady needs to be kind, gentle, capable of going toe to toe with her warrior, and in constant trouble and in need of being rescued and protected.
