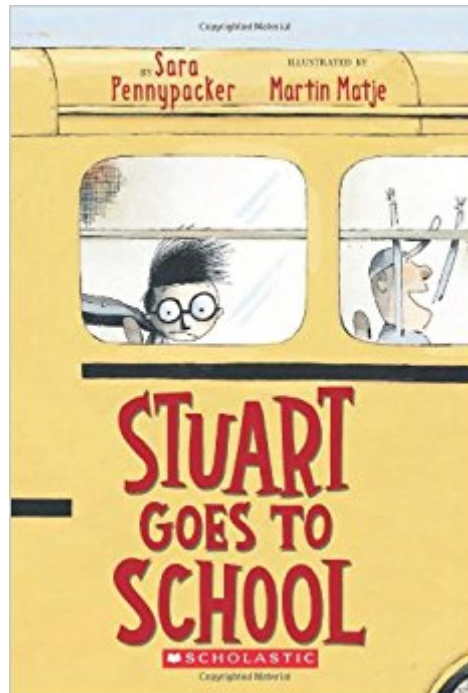

Grade 2-4-A sequel to *Stuart's Cape* (Orchard, 2002), this humorous fantasy perfectly captures the child's-eye view of elementary-school life. Stuart, who is "excellent at worrying," finds plenty to

agonize over as he starts third grade at a new school. What if he gets stuck in the bathroom or throws up? Why does he have to wear his father's ugly cowboy shirt and green plaid pants? His only consolation is his magical cape. When he wears it, unexpected adventures happen. To impress his classmates, the boy decides to try controlling the cape's arcane powers. He wishes for the hideous hand-me-down outfit to disappear but suddenly finds himself standing in his underwear. Stuart is convinced that he will be the laughingstock of the third grade forever. My son, who is a third grader, enjoyed the book. It is readable in 5-10 minutes. I teach third grade, and plan on using it next year at the beginning of the year to tie some art and self-portraits into the start of school, as well as a lead-in to some of the feelings we might have when we are new.

Reason for Reading: Honestly, the illustrations had me! This is a cute little story in a chapter book format that is really intended for reading aloud. Being about a third grader it certainly is for the

younger crowd but elementary students will probably have a hard time reading it themselves as it is not exactly an easy read and the print is quite tiny. No, this story is going to be much more appreciated as a read aloud. It's the first day of school once again and Stuart, constant worrier, has even more things to worry about than usual. But with the help of his magical cape he made for himself he thinks he'll be able to make it big at school this year. Well, magic doesn't always work the way you want it to and Stuart ends up having some hilarious adventures and in the end the cape does help him make friends but not because of the magic. The last page contains a step-by step "how to draw Stuart" which looks simple enough for anyone to try. The illustrations throughout are really adorable and this is a fun, quick read.

The book *Stuart Goes to School* by Sara Pennypacker and illustrated by Martin Matje is an interesting and entertaining book. A little boy named Stuart worries about his first day in a new school. He worries he has forgotten what he learned in second grade, about making friends, getting lost going to the bathroom and getting stuck in the bathroom.
