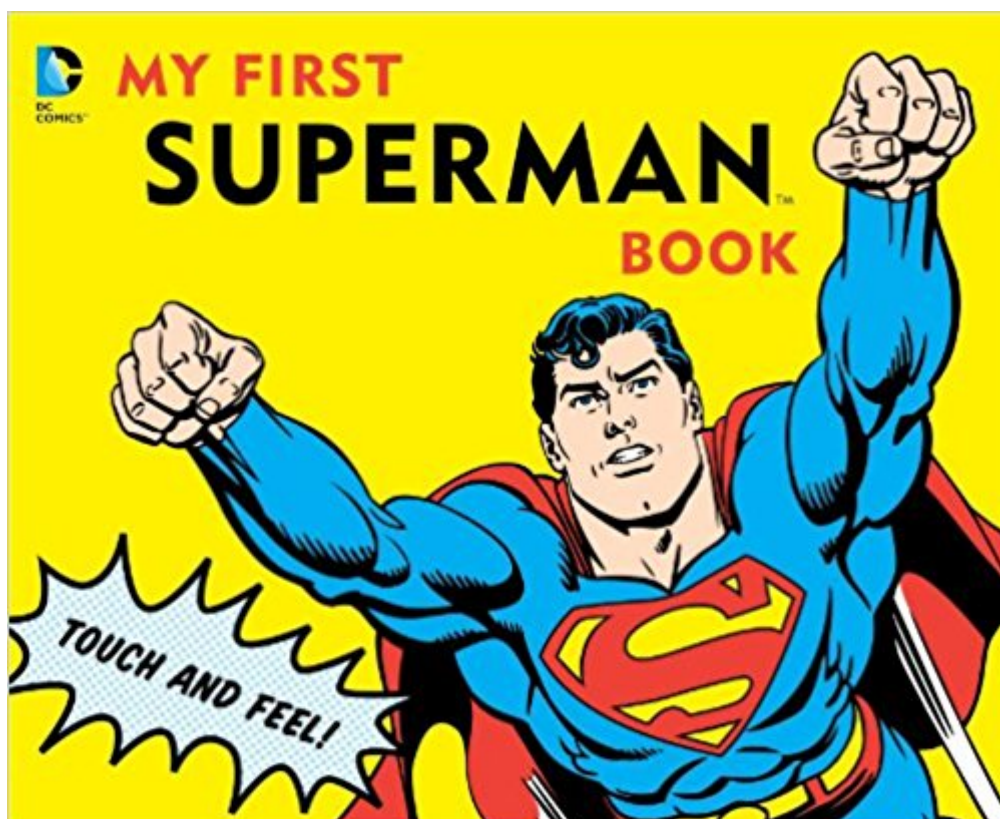

My husband has been really into all the super heroes ever since he was little, as I'm sure a lot of boys were and probably still are. I really knew nothing about them until I decided to purchase my two year old a couple. I gave them to her for Christmas and she really took to them. We both really enjoy reading them together and have both learned so many name of superheroes and what their powers are. But what I love most about these books, is that its not really all about the superhero,

they teach lessons, and they teach things like colors, shapes, words, counting, and body parts. They really are wonderful books - I let my daughter choose one of these books every night and we read together at bed time. My toddler and I started collecting all of them and we both get really excited when they arrive in the mail. My daughter started to think that the mail man was just giving them to us as gifts, as if I didn't have to buy them lol. We have collected every one and they are releasing another one next week which we have already pre ordered and are super excited about. The books are a great price and arrive quickly. I hope they continue to make these books because we really love collecting them and enjoy reading them. She is even starting to remember the words and "reads" along with me!

When my three year old who's crazy about superheroes, wanted to get his little brother a book about Superman, I searched and found this. The pages are nice and thick, easy for little fingers to turn. The illustration is great with good embellishments for young readers like the rippling muscles or the fur on Krypto. I'm taking away one star for the following two issues: There is a sparkly page for the Fortress of Solitude which looks great but seems to lose a glitter to sticky little fingers and the pull tab to make Clark Kent run into the phone booth and emerge as Superman is too tough for little hands to pull. It's so tough that within a day the tab had been ripped off by my older son as he attempted to read to his little brother. It's just a bit too delicate for a kids book and I fear the other x-ray pull tab feature will reach the same fate eventually. In fact, I can't think of any other books for this age group that we own that have that kind of feature. Aside from those issues the book itself is great for little ones, I just wish the publisher had considered that it's not just moms and dads who would be handling it. *Edit* 4/1/13 Shortly after posting the review I emailed the company to mention the issue with the torn page. They were very helpful and even offered to send me another book. I took them up on that and am anxiously awaiting the replacement, which we'll try to avoid damaging it quite so quickly.

We have Superman Colors book and my 9 month old son absolutely loves it. So I wanted to get another Superman book for him. The book looks great as it has bold colors and to keep babies enticed, and cool pull out tabs. However, the tabs seem very flimsy and I don't see it holding too well if I have him play with the book. And my biggest gripe is the page full of glitter...and I mean the glitter was everywhere. When I got to the page, there was a layer of loose glitter all over. I tried to scrape off some of the glitter but no luck, I just ended up getting covered in glitter. I have no problem with glitter if it stays on, but the glue material they used here is not good at all. Everytime you touch

the area with glitter, there will be glitter on your hand. I just don't understand who thought it would be a great idea to use glitter on a book for babies. Babies want to touch everything and put everything in their mouth. My son would be practically eating glitter if he played with this book. This will be another read out loud book for him I suppose.

I bought this as a gift for a friend of mine's baby so I haven't seen how kids like it but It seems like a really fun book. It has pull tabs (which are a bit tough to pull but I think that is a positive so the baby won't pull it out) and fabric to touch. The reason I gave it 4 stars was because one page is covered in glitter which I think doesn't seem like a safe idea for a babies book.

My one year old loves this book, almost obsessively so. I frequently have to stash the book somewhere for a few hours, so that I'm not roped into reading it over and over again. He's particularly mesmerized by the pages that demonstrate Superman's x-ray vision and costume changes. Out of the three books on (Wonder Woman, Batman, and Superman), I'd say this one is the most fun, with the most interactive features that are interesting to children.

My son LOVES this book. He's only 20 months so I'm sure he'll get more use out of it when he's older. The only downside to this book is that we're now on our second one due to the first breaking. A couple of the pages have small tabs that control the panels in the pages and they're easily broken like other reviewers have said. The glitter on the fortress of solitude page isn't a problem for us, it's my sons favorite page. I would have to say maybe wait until after a child is 3 or 4 years old for this book.

My grandson will love this highly engaging book.

This is my son's favorite book. The tab for the Clark Kent changes into Superman page broke easily, but we are still able to slide the picture back and forth behind the phone booth. We had no problems with excessive amounts of glitter falling off of the Fortress of Solitude page.
